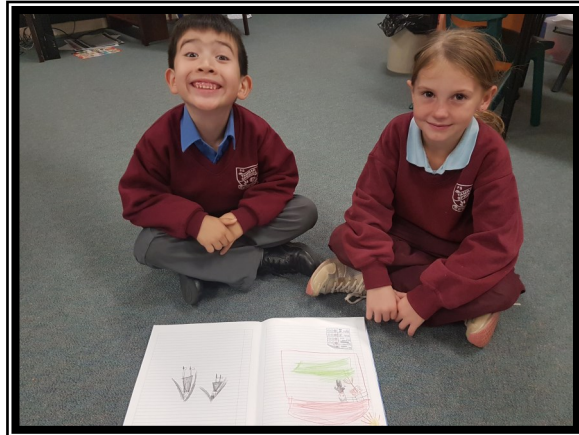

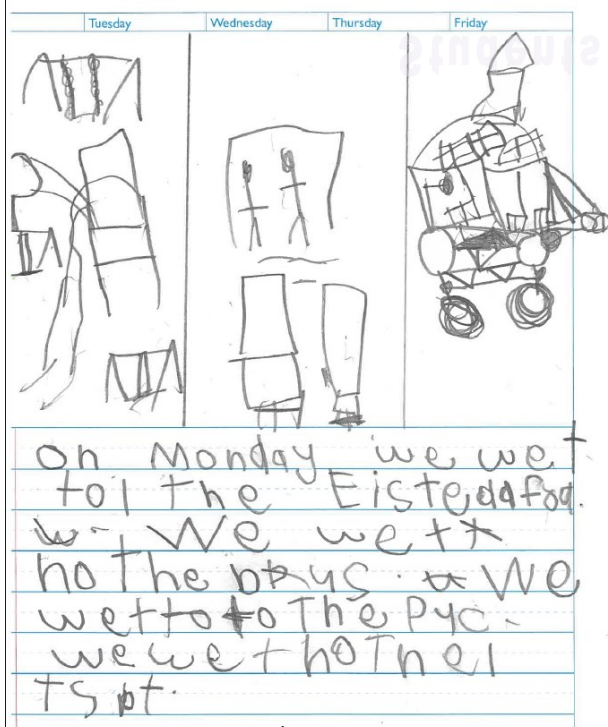
Healthy Eating & Living Program

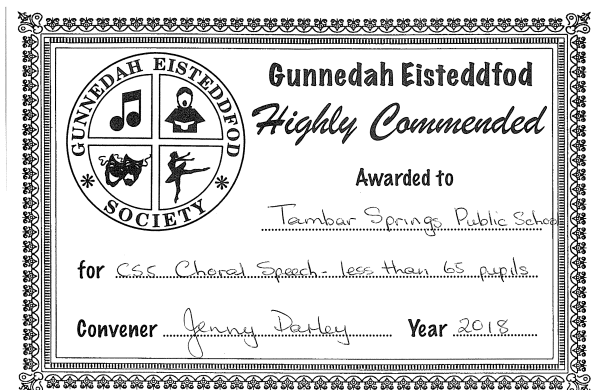
