

Muster at Tambar Springs

Bringing the farm into the classroom was a reality for Tambar Springs students. The students had a video conference with a farmer and grazier on an 800 hectare farm in Victoria. Twenty-three schools participated in quizzes and online chats with the farmer. Students learnt valuable lessons of how farmers look after the land and animals so their farms are sustainable. It was very exciting for the students to see other students from different schools. We learnt about how the different technology on a farm is used to check water levels, pump water and view pests and diseases in crops.

We will be putting ear tags on our own cows next week to identify our herd. (The cardboard breed.)

Welcome to our new casual helper at the school Vanessa Voyez. Vanessa has been helping in the classroom and office and has worked at Coonabarabran in this role. Vanessa has helped the students make their own props for drama. It is evident that Vanessa is quite creative and can make resources from basic materials.


