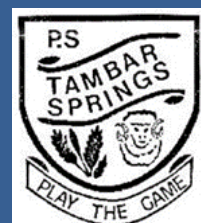

Mrs Fouracre brought in a fudge cake to make which was appreciated by all the children. Some of the responses:

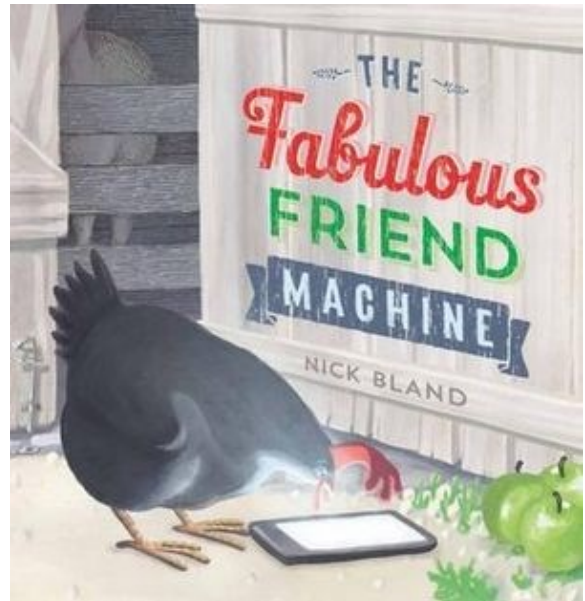
Matthew—"It looks like a chocolate waterfall. It looks as springy as a trampoline. It smells as sweet as a flower."
