Last day of Term 2.

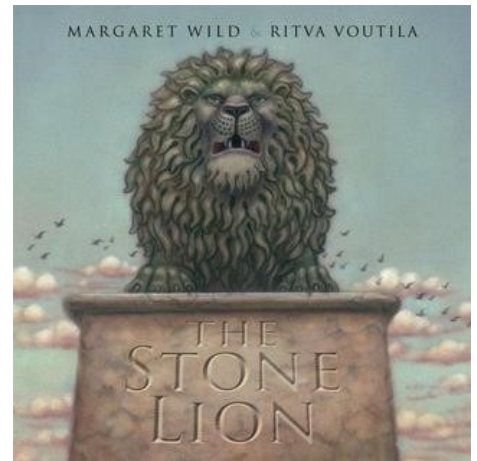
THE STONE LION

At first the lion is sad because everyone goes past or is scared of him.

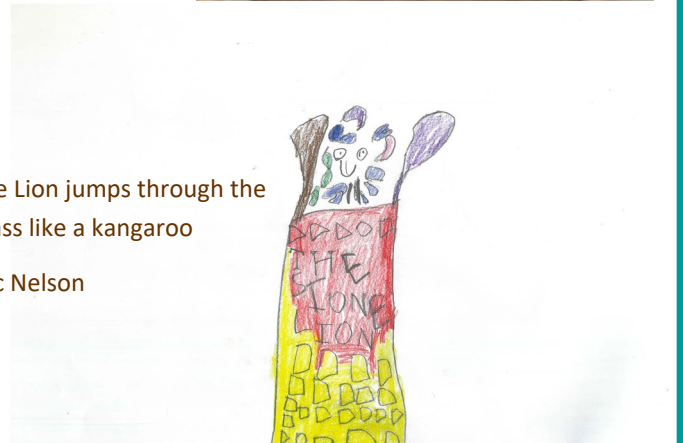
In the middle of the story he imagines leaping and pouncing and crawling across the streets.

Falling flat as a pancake.

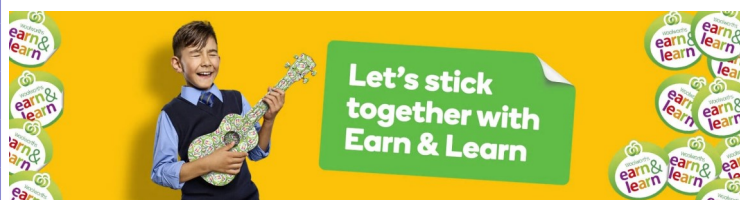
